The following are questions, with respective answers, for the above Request for Quotes:

1. QUESTION – This solicitation requests the old style air freshener with the fragranced block. Would you accept a quote for the new style battery diffuser? It is a similar size dispenser with better and consistent performance. Instead of "a mixture of aroma chemicals, essential oils, and natural extracts compressed into fibrous squares or similar size/shape that will fit into the air freshener" it has a bottle of the liquid essential oils and deodorant that is diffused out as a gas into the restroom.

ANSWER – We will need a specification sheet detailing air freshener equipment with the bid as part of the Quote Package Requirements, but we are open to other options.

SECTION 1 GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. **GENERAL INFORMATION**

These specifications constitute the complete set of requirements and quotation forms. The quotation page(s), and all forms listed on the quotation page(s) are to be filled in, signed, and submitted to the Procurement Division on or before the specified time and date.

It is the sole responsibility of the Quoter to ensure that their quotation reaches the Procurement Division on or before the closing date and time. The County shall in no way be responsible for delays caused by any occurrence. Offers by telephone shall not be accepted.

The County will not be responsible for late deliveries or delayed mail. Any quotation received prior to award may be considered if it is determined to be in the County's best interest.

All quotations must be typewritten or handwritten in with pen and ink, and must be signed in ink by an officer or employee having authority to bind the company or firm. Errors, corrections, or changes on any document must be initialed by the signatory of the quotation.

Quotation files may be examined in accordance with Florida Sunshine Laws.

2. QUESTIONS REGARDING THIS SOLICITATION

All questions or concerns regarding this Request for Quotes shall be submitted by email to the Procurement Division representative specified on the cover page of this Request for Quotes. Consideration for modification or alteration of the documents contained in this solicitation shall be requested during the specified question specified on the cover page of this Request for Ouotes.

When required the Procurement Division shall issue and disseminate an addendum to the Request for Quotes.

Quoters are instructed not to contact the initiating division directly. No oral interpretation of this Request for Quotes shall be considered binding. The County shall be bound by information and statements only when such statements are written and executed under the authority of the Manager, Procurement Division.

This provision exists solely for the convenience and administrative efficiency of Orange County. No Quoter or other third party gains any rights by virtue of this provision or the application thereof, nor shall any Quoter or third party have any standing to sue or cause of action arising there from.

3. <u>PRICE/DELIVERY</u>

Price(s) quote must be the price(s) for new goods, unless otherwise specified. Any quotes containing modifying or "escalator" clauses will not be considered unless specifically requested in the quote specifications.

"Acceptance" as herein used means the acceptance by Orange County after the Manager, Procurement Division or authorized agent has, by inspection or test of such items, determined that they fully comply with specifications.

Deliveries resulting from this quote are to be performed during the normal working hours of the County. Time is of the essence and the Contractor's delivery date must be specified and adhered to. Should the Contractor, to whom the order or contract is awarded, fail to deliver on or before the stated date, the County reserves the right to CANCEL the order or contract and make the purchase elsewhere, and the Contractor shall be required to compensate the County for the difference in price paid for the alternate goods. The Contractor shall be responsible for making any and all claims against carriers for missing or damage goods. Partial shipments will be acceptable unless otherwise stated.

4. FEDERAL AND STATE TAX

The County is exempt from Federal and State Sales and Use Taxes for tangible personal property (Certificate of Registry for tax transactions under Chapter 32, Internal Revenue Code and Florida Sales/Use Tax Exemption Certificate). The Manager, Procurement Division will sign an exemption certificate submitted by the Contractor.

Contractors doing business with the County shall not be exempted from paying sales tax to their suppliers for materials to fulfill contractual obligations with the County, nor shall any Contractor be authorized to use the County's Tax Exemption Number in securing such materials.

5. ACCEPTANCE/REJECTION/CANCELLATION

The County reserves the right to accept or to reject any or all quotes and to make the award to that quoter who, in the opinion of the County, will be in the best interest of and/or the most advantageous to the County. The County also reserves the right to reject the quote of any quoter who has previously failed in the proper performance of an award or to deliver on time contracts of a similar nature or who, in the County's opinion, is not in a position to perform properly under this award. The County reserves the right to inspect all facilities of quoters in order to make a determination as to the foregoing. The County reserves the right to waive any irregularities and technicalities and may, at its discretion, request a re-quote. Award will be made to the lowest responsive and responsible quoter as determined by the County.

The County reserves the right, and the Manager, Procurement Division has absolute and sole discretion, to cancel a solicitation at any time.

6. CONFLICT OF INTEREST

The award is subject to provisions of applicable State Statutes and County Ordinances. All quoters must disclose with their quote the name of any officer, director, or agent who is also an employee of Orange County. Further, all quoters must disclose the name of any County employee who owns, directly or indirectly, an interest of ten percent (10%) or more in the Quoter's firm or any of its branches. Should the Contractor permanently or temporarily hire any County employee who is, or has been, directly involved with the Contractor prior to or during performance of the resulting contract, the contract shall be subject to immediate termination by the County.

7. LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

All applicable Federal and State laws and County ordinances that in any manner affect the items covered herein apply. Lack of knowledge by the Quoter shall in no way be a cause for relief from responsibility.

A. Contractors doing business with the County are prohibited from discriminating against any employees, applicant, or client because of race, religion, color, disability, national origin, gender, or age with regard to but not limited to the following: employment practices, rates of pay or other compensation methods, and training selection.

8. GOVERNING LAW AND VENUE

Any and all legal actions associated with this contract will be governed by the laws of the State of Florida. Venue for any litigation involving this contract shall be in the Ninth Circuit Court in and for Orange County, Florida. Should any federal claims arise for which the courts of the State of Florida lack jurisdiction, venue for those actions will be in the Orlando Division of the U.S. Middle District of Florida.

9. **JURY WAIVER**

Each party hereto hereby irrevocably waives, to the fullest extent permitted by applicable law, any right it may have to a trial by jury in any legal proceeding directly or indirectly arising out of or relating to this agreement.

10. <u>ATTORNEYS' FEES AND COSTS</u>

The Parties shall each bear their own costs, expert fees, attorneys' fees, and other fees incurred in connection with this Agreement and any litigation that arises either directly, or indirectly.

11. UNIFORM COMMERCIAL CODE

If commodities are being furnished, the Uniform Commercial Code (Florida Statutes, Chapter 672) shall prevail as the basis for contractual obligations between the Contractor and the County for any terms and conditions not specifically stated in this Request for Quotes.

12. LAWS AND REGULATIONS

The Respondent's attention is directed to the fact that all applicable Federal and State laws, municipal and county ordinances, and the rules and regulations of all authorities having jurisdiction over any part of the project shall apply to the Contract throughout, and they will be deemed to be included in the Contract the same as though herein written.

Respondents are hereby provided notice of the provisions of Section 287.05701, Florida Statutes

13. MISTAKES

In the event of extension error(s), the unit price will prevail and the Quoter's total offer will be corrected accordingly. In the event of additional errors, the extended totals will prevail and the Quoter's total will be corrected accordingly. Quoters must check their quote where applicable. Failure to do so will be at the Quoter's risk. Quotes having erasures or corrections must be initialed in ink by the Quoter.

14. AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS

The obligations of the County under this award are subject to the availability of funds lawfully appropriated for its purpose by the State of Florida and Orange County, Florida, or other specified funding source for this procurement.

15. <u>NON-DISCRIMINATION</u>

The County's policies of equal opportunity and non-discrimination are intended to assure equal opportunities to every person, regardless of race, religion, sex, color, age, disability or national origin, in securing or holding employment in a field of work or labor for which the person is qualified, as provided and enforced by Section 17-314 of the Orange County Code and the County's relevant Administrative Regulations. It is also the county policy that person(s) doing business with the County shall recognize and comply with this policy and that the County shall not extend public funds or resources in a manner as would encourage, perpetuate or foster discrimination. As such:

- 1. The Contractor shall adopt and maintain, or provide evidence to the County that Contractor has adopted and maintains, a policy of nondiscrimination as defined by Section 17-288, Orange County Code, throughout the term of this Agreement.
- 2. The Contractor agrees that, on written request, the Association shall permit reasonable access to all business records or employment, employment advertisement, applications forms, and other pertinent data and records, by the County, for the purpose of investigating to ascertain compliance with the non-discrimination provisions of this contract; provided, that the Contractor shall not be required to produce for inspection records covering periods of time more than one year prior to the date of this Agreement.
- 3. The Contractor agrees that, if any obligations of this contract are to be performed by subcontractor(s), the provisions of subparagraphs 1 and 2 of this Section shall be incorporated into and become a part of the subcontract.

16. **QUOTE FORMS**

All quotes shall be submitted on the County's standard Quote Response Form. Modification of the Quote Response Form herein or submission of Quotes on Quoter's quotation forms shall not be accepted and shall be deemed non-responsive.

17. REFERENCES

A contact person shall be someone who has personal knowledge of the Quoter's performance for the specific requirement listed. Contact person shall have been informed that they are being used as a reference and that the County may be contacting them. More than one person can be listed but all shall have knowledge of the project. The reference shall be the owner or a representative of the owner. Contractors who provided services under the referenced project (contract) shall not be accepted as references. **<u>DO NOT</u>** list principals or officers who shall not be able to answer specific questions regarding the project. Failure of references listed to respond to the County's inquiries may negatively impact the responsibility of the Quoter.

18. QUOTE AND RELATED COSTS

By submission of a quote, the Quoter agrees that any and all costs associated with the preparation of the quote will be the sole responsibility of the Quoter. The Quoter also agrees that the County shall bear no responsibility for any costs associated with the preparation of the quote including but not limited to any administrative or judicial proceedings resulting from the solicitation process.

19. <u>CONTRACTUAL AGREEMENT</u>

This Request for Quotes shall be included and incorporated in the final contract or purchase order. The order of contract precedence will be the contract (purchase order), quote document, and response.

20. PUBLIC ENTITY CRIME

26. <u>DEVELOPMENT OR ASSISTANCE IN DEVELOPMENT OF SPECIFICATIONS/</u> REQUIREMENTS/ STATEMENTS OF WORK

28. PATENTS AND ROYALTIES

Unless otherwise provided, the Contractor shall be solely responsible for obtaining the right to use any patented or copyrighted materials in the performance of the contract resulting from this Request for Quotes.

The Contractor, without exception, shall indemnify and save harmless the County and its employees from liability of any nature or kind, including cost and expenses for or on account of any copyrighted, patented, or unpatented invention, process, or article manufactured or supplied by the Contractor. In the event of any claim against the County of copyright or patent infringement, the County shall promptly provide written notification to the Contractor. If such a claim is made, the Contractor shall use its best efforts to promptly purchase for the County any infringing products or services or procure a license, at no cost to the County, which will allow continued use of the service or product.

If none of the alternatives are reasonably available, the County agrees to return the article on request to the Contractor and receive reimbursement, if any, as may be determined by a court of competent jurisdiction.

29. <u>INDEMNIFICATION</u>

To the fullest extent permitted by law, the Contractor shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the County, its officials, agents, and employees from and against any and all claims, suits, judgments, demands, liabilities, damages, cost and expenses including attorney's fees of any kind or nature whatsoever arising directly or indirectly out of or caused in whole or in part by any act or omission of the Contractor or its subcontractors, anyone directly or indirectly employed by them, or anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable; excepting those acts or omissions arising out of the sole negligence of the County.

30. <u>CLARIFICATIONS</u>

It is the Quoter's responsibility to become familiar with and fully informed regarding the terms, conditions and specifications of this Request for Quotes. Lack of understanding and/or misinterpretation of any portions of this Request for Quotes shall not be cause for withdrawal of your quote after opening. Quoter's must contact the Procurement Division, at the phone number on the quote cover sheet **prior** to quote opening, should clarification be required.

Modification or alteration of the documents contained in the solicitation or contract shall only be valid if mutually agreed to in writing by the Quoter and the County.

31. CERTIFICATION OF INDEPENDENT PRICE DETERMINATION

By submission of this quote, the Quoter certifies, and in the case of a joint quote each party thereto certifies as to its own organization, that in connection with this procurement:

- A. The prices in this quote have been arrived at independently, without consultation, collusion, communication, or agreement for the purpose of restricting competition, as to any matter relating to such prices with any other quoter or with any competitor.
- B. Unless otherwise required by law, the prices which have been quoted in this quote have not been knowingly disclosed by the Quoter and will not knowingly be disclosed by the Quoter prior to opening, directly or indirectly to any other Quoter or to any competitor; and,
- C. No attempt has been made or shall be made by the Quoter to induce any other person or quoter to submit or not to submit a quote for the purpose of restricting competition.

32. <u>SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS</u>

The County and the Contractor each binds itself and its partners, successors, executors, administrators, and assigns to the other party of this Contract and to the partners, successors, executors, administrators, and assigns of such other party, in respect to all covenants of this Contract. Except as above, neither the County nor the Contractor shall assign, sublet, convey or transfer its interest in this Contract without the written consent of the other. Nothing herein shall be construed as creating any personal liability on the part of any officer or agent of the County which may be a party hereto, nor shall it be construed as giving any rights or benefits hereunder to anyone other than the County and the Contractor.

33. NO REPRESENTATIONS

Each party represents that they have had the opportunity to consult with an attorney, and have carefully read and understand the scope and effect of the provisions of this Agreement. Neither party has relied upon any representations or statements made by the other party hereto which are not specifically set forth in this Agreement.

34. SEVERABILITY

The provisions of this Agreement are declared by the parties to be severable. However, the material provisions of this Agreement are dependent upon one another, and such interdependencies a material inducement for the parties to enter into this Agreement. Therefore, should any material term, provision, covenant or condition of this Agreement be held invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, the party protected or benefited by such term, provision, covenant, or condition may demand that the parties

negotiate such reasonable alternate contract language or provisions as may be necessary either to restore the protected or benefited party to its previous position or otherwise mitigate the loss of protection or benefit resulting from holding.

35. PRICING/AUDIT

The Contractor shall establish and maintain a reasonable accounting system, which enables ready identification of Contractor's cost of goods and use of funds.

Such accounting system shall also include adequate records and documents to justify all prices for all items invoiced as well as all charges, expenses and costs incurred in providing the goods for at least five (5) years after completion of this contract. The County or its designee shall have access to such books, records, subcontract(s), financial operations, and documents of the Contractor or its subcontractors, as required to comply with this section for the purpose of inspection or audit anytime during normal business hours at the Contractor's place of business. This right to audit shall include the Contractor's subcontractors used to procure goods under the contract with the County. Contractor shall ensure the County has these same rights with subcontractors and suppliers.

36. EMPLOYEES OF THE CONTRACTOR

All work under this contract shall be performed in a professional and skillful manner. The County may require, in writing, that the Contractor, remove from this contract any employee the County deems incompetent, careless, or otherwise objectionable.

37. SINGLE-USE PRODUCTS

The Board of County Commissioners has established a single-use products and plastic bags policy intended to reduce the use of products which have become globally recognized as having lasting negative impacts on the environment.

Neither single-use products nor plastic bags may be sold or disbursed on County property by staff or contracted vendors, except as set forth in Orange County Administrative Regulation 9.01.03. Failure to comply with the Regulation may result in termination of the contract or other contractual remedies, and may affect future contracting with the County. The use of reusable, recyclable, biodegradable, or compostable materials is encouraged.

38. TOBACCO FREE CAMPUS

All Orange County operations under the Board of County Commissioners shall be tobacco free. This policy shall apply to parking lots, parks, break areas and worksites. It is also applicable to Contractors and their personnel during contract performance on County owned property. Tobacco is defined as tobacco products including, but not limited to, cigars, cigarettes, e-cigarettes, pipes, chewing tobacco and snuff. Failure to abide by this policy may result in civil penalties levied under Chapter 386, Florida Statutes and/or contract enforcement remedies.

39. CONTRACT CLAIMS

"Claim" as used in this provision means a written demand or written assertion by one of the contracting parties seeking as a matter of right, the payment of a certain sum of money, the adjustment or interpretation of contract terms, or other relief arising under or relating to this contract.

Claims made by a Contractor against the County, relating to a particular contract shall be submitted to the Manager, Procurement Division in writing clearly labeled "Contract Claim" requesting a final decision. The Contractor also shall provide with the claim a certification as follows: "I certify that the claim is made in good faith; that the supporting data are accurate and complete to the best of my knowledge and belief; that the amount requested accurately reflects the contract adjustment for which the Contractor believes the County is liable; and that I am duly authorized to certify the claim on behalf of the Contractor."

<u>Failure to document a claim in this manner shall render the claim null and void.</u> No claim shall be accepted after final payment of the contract.

The decision of the Manager, Procurement Division shall be issued in writing and furnished to the Contractor. The decision shall state the reasons for the decision reached. The Manager, Procurement Division shall render the final decision within sixty (60) days after receipt of Contractor's written request for a final decision. The Manager, Procurement Division decision shall be final and conclusive.

The Contractor shall proceed diligently with performance of this contract pending final resolution of any request for relief, claim, appeal or action arising under the contract and shall comply with any final decision rendered by the Manager, Procurement Division.

40. VERIFICATION OF EMPLOYMENT STATUS

The Contractor is required to be registered with the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's E-Verify system prior to entering into a contract with Orange County. The Contractor shall use the E-Verify system to verify the employment eligibility of all new employees hired by the Contractor during the contract term. The Contractor shall include an express provision in all of its subcontracts requiring subcontractors, who perform work or provide services pursuant to the contract, to use the E-Verify system to verify the employment eligibility of all new employees hired by the subcontractor during the contract term. Only those employees determined eligible to work within the United States shall be employed under this contract.

By submission of a bid in response to this solicitation, the Contractor affirms that all employees in the above categories shall undergo e-verification before placement on this contract. The Contractor shall commit to comply with this requirement by completing the E-Verification certification, attached to this solicitation.

A public employer, contractor, or subcontractor who has a good faith belief that a person or entity with which it is contracting has knowingly violated Section 448.09(1), Florida Statutes is obligated to terminate the contract with the person or entity pursuant to Section 448.095(2)(c)1, Florida Statutes. If Orange County terminates the contract for the foregoing reason, the contractor may not be awarded a public contract for at least one (1) year after the date on which the contract was terminated, and the contractor will be liable for any additional costs incurred by Orange County as a result of the termination of the contract.

41. CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION

In accordance with Chapter 119 of the Florida Statutes (Public Records Law), and except as may be provided by other applicable State or Federal Law, all quoters should be aware that formal solicitations and the responses thereto are in the public domain. Requests for confidential treatment will not supersede the County's legal obligation to provide records to the public consistent with public records law. Quoter must cite specific, applicable legal grounds to support a request for confidential treatment, of any portion of a quote. Requests by quoters to keep entire quotes confidential are generally not supported by public records laws. At a minimum, the County will disclose the successful quoter's name, the substance of the quote, and the price.

If the quoter requests confidential treatment, quoter must submit an additional copy of the Quote with the proposed confidential information redacted. This copy must include a general description of the information redacted, and shall only be redacted in the least expansive manner necessary to effectuate the requested exemption(s). In a separate attachment, quoter shall supply a listing of the provisions identified by section number for which it seeks confidential treatment and identify the statutory basis under Florida law, including a detailed justification for exempting the information from public disclosure.

Quoter shall hold harmless and indemnify the County for all claims, actions, suits, judgments, fines, costs or damages the County may incur as a result of bidder's/proposer's request for confidential treatment of its Quote. Quoter agrees and understands that the County may make copies of, and distribute, the Quote without any requested redactions, to facilitate evaluation. Quoter warrants that such copying will not violate the rights of any third party.

42. FEDERAL REQUIREMENTS

In the event this Contract is paid in whole or in part from any federal government agency or source, the specific terms, regulations and requirements governing the disbursement of these funds shall be specified herein and become a part of this clause.

<u>Equal Employment Opportunity:</u> For any federally assisted construction contract, as defined in 41 CFR 60-1.3, the contractor, subcontractor, subrecipient shall follow all of the requirements of the Equal Opportunity Clause as stated in 41 CFR 60-1.4.

<u>Davis–Bacon Act</u>: For any federally assisted construction contract, in excess of two thousand dollars (\$2,000), the contractor, subcontractor, subrecipient shall comply with all of the requirements of the Davis-Bacon Act (40 U.S.C. 3141 – 3148) as supplemented by Department of Labor Regulations (29 CFR Part 5, "Labor Standards Provisions Applicable to Contracts Covering Federally Financed and assisted Construction"); and the Copeland "Anti-Kickback" Act (40 U.S.C. 3145), as supplemented by Department of Labor regulations (29 CFR Part 3, "Contractors and Subcontractors on Public Building or Public Work Financed in Whole or in Part by Loans or Grants from the United States").

For a definition of "Construction" see 48 CFR 2.101.

- B. Specifically, by executing this Agreement, the Contractor/Sub-Recipient certifies that it is <u>not</u> on the Scrutinized Companies that Boycott Israel List, created pursuant to Section 215.4725, Florida Statutes, or is engaged in a boycott of Israel.

- C. Additionally, if this Agreement is for an amount of one million dollars (\$1,000,000) or more, by executing this Agreement, the Contractor/Sub-Recipient certifies that it is not:
 - 1. On the "Scrutinized Companies with Activities in Sudan List" or the "Scrutinized Companies with Activities in the Iran Petroleum Energy Sector List," created pursuant to Section 215.473, Florida Statutes; and/or

- D. The County reserves the right to terminate this Agreement immediately should the Contractor be found to:
 - 3. Have falsified its certification of eligibility to quote on, submit a proposal for, or enter into or renew a contract with the County for goods or services pursuant to Section 287.135, Florida Statutes; and/or
 - 4. Have become ineligible to quote on, submit a proposal for, or enter into or renew a contract with the County for goods or services pursuant to Section 287.135, Florida Statute subsequent to entering into this Agreement with the County.
- E. If this Agreement is terminated by the County as provided in subparagraph 4(a) above, the County reserves the right to pursue any and all available legal remedies against the Contractor, including but not limited to the remedies as described in Section 287.135, Florida Statutes.
- F. If this Agreement is terminated by the County as provided in subparagraph 4(b) above, the Contractor shall be paid only for the funding-applicable work completed as of the date of the County's termination.
- G. Unless explicitly stated in this Section, no other damages, fees, and/or costs may be assessed against the County for its termination of the Agreement pursuant to this Section.

44. <u>PUBLIC RECORDS COMPLIANCE (APPLICABLE FOR SERVICE CONTRACTS)</u> Orange County is a public agency subject to Chapter 119, Florida Statutes. The Contractor agrees to comply with Florida's Public Records Law. Specifically, the Contractor shall:

- 1. Keep and maintain public records required by Orange County to perform the service.
- 2. Upon request from Orange County's custodian of public records, provide Orange County with a copy of the requested records or allow the records to be inspected or copied within a reasonable time at a cost that does not exceed the cost provided in this chapter or as otherwise provided by law.
- 3. Ensure that public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from the public records disclosure requirements are not disclosed except as authorized by law for the duration of the contract term and following completion of the contract if the Contractor does not transfer the records to Orange County.

- 4. Upon completion of the contract, Contractor agrees to transfer at no cost to Orange County all public records in possession of the Contractor or keep and maintain public records required by Orange County to perform the service. If the Contractor transfers all public record to Orange County upon completion of the contract, the Contractor shall destroy any duplicate public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements. If the Contractor keeps and maintains public records upon completion of the contract, the Contractor shall meet all applicable requirements for retaining public records. All records stored electronically must be provided to Orange County, upon request from Orange County's custodian of public records, in a format that is compatible with the information technology systems of Orange County.
- 5. A Contractor who fails to provide the public records to Orange County within a reasonable time may be subject to penalties under section 119.10, Florida Statutes.

SECTION 2 SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. <u>LICENSES AND PERMITS</u>

Prior to furnishing the requested product(s), it shall be the responsibility of the Contractor to obtain, at no additional cost to Orange County, any and all licenses and permits required to complete all contractual requirements. These licenses and permits shall be readily available for review by the Manager, Procurement Division or authorized designee.

2. QUOTE ACCEPTANCE PERIOD

A quote shall constitute an irrevocable offer for a period of ninety (90) days from the quote opening date or until the date of award. In the event that an award is not made by the County within ninety (90) days from the quote opening date, the Quoter may withdraw their quote or provide a written extension of their quote.

3. FLORIDA CONVICTED/SUSPENDED/DISCRIMINATORY COMPLAINTS

By submission of an offer, the respondent affirms that it is not currently listed in the Florida Department of Management Services Convicted/Suspended/Discriminatory Complaint Vendor List.

4. <u>AWARD</u>

Award shall be made on an <u>all-or-none total estimated quote</u> basis to the lowest responsive and responsible Quoter.

5. POST AWARD MEETING

Within **ten** (10) days after receipt of notification of award of quote, Contractor shall meet with the County's representative(s) to discuss job procedures and scheduling.

6. <u>PERFORMANCE</u> Timely performance is of the essence in the award of this Request for Quotations. Performance shall be no later than ten (10) calendar days from receipt of delivery order. Quotes which fail to meet this requirement shall be rejected.

It is hereby understood and mutually agreed to by and between parties hereto that the time of performance is an essential condition of this contract.

Should the Contractor neglect, fail or refuse to provide the services within the time herein specified, then said Contractor does hereby agree as part of the consideration for the awarding of this contract, to pay Orange County the sum extended by the County to contract for like services approved by the Procurement Division for the period from the required scheduled commencement date until performance of services covered in the Request for Quotations is completed.

The Contractor shall, within <u>ten</u> (10) calendar days from the beginning of such delay, notify the Manager, Procurement Division in writing of the cause(s) of the delay.

7. FORCE MAJEURE

1. The Contractor shall not be held responsible for any delay and/or failure in performance of any part of this contract to the extent such delay or failure is caused by explosion, war, embargo, government requirement, civil or military authority, act of God, or other similar causes beyond the Contractor's control so long as the Contractor's delay is not caused by the Contractor's own fault or negligence. That notwithstanding, the

Contractor shall notify the County in writing within twenty-four (24) hours after the beginning of any such cause that would affect its performance hereunder and the County reserves the right the request additional information that supports the validity of the Contractor's Force Majeure claim. Failure to notify the County in a timely manner of any claim of Force Majeure made pursuant to this section is cause for termination of this contract.

- 2. If the Contractor's performance is delayed pursuant to this section for a period exceeding ten (10) calendar days from the date the County receives the required Force Majeure notice, the County shall have the right to terminate this contract thereafter and shall only be liable to the Contractor for any work performed and validated (if required for payment hereunder) prior to the date of the County's contract termination.
- 3. If the Contractor's performance is delayed pursuant to this section, the County may, upon written request of the Contractor, agree to equitably adjust the provisions of this contract, including price, performance, and delivery, as may be affected by such delay. However, this provision shall not be interpreted to limit the County's right to terminate for convenience.

8. TERMINATION

A. <u>Termination for Default:</u>

The County may, by written notice to the Contractor terminate this contract for default in whole or in part (delivery orders, if applicable) if the Contractor fails to:

- 1. Provide goods or services that comply with the specifications herein or fails to meet the County's performance standards
- 2. Deliver the goods or to perform the services within the time specified in this contract or any extension.
- 3. Make progress so as to endanger performance of this contract
- 4. Perform any of the other provisions of this contract.

Prior to termination for default, the County shall provide adequate written notice to the Contractor through the Manager, Procurement Division, affording the opportunity to cure the deficiencies or to submit a specific plan to resolve the deficiencies within ten (10) calendar days (or the period specified in the notice) after receipt of the notice. Failure to adequately cure the deficiency shall result in termination action. Such termination may also result in suspension or debarment of the Contractor in accordance with the County's Procurement Ordinance. The Contractor and its sureties (if any) shall be liable for any damage to the County resulting from the Contractor's default of the contract. This liability includes any increased costs incurred by the County in completing contract performance.

In the event of termination by the County for any cause, the Contractor shall have, in no event, any claim against the County for lost profits or compensation for lost opportunities. After a receipt of a Termination Notice and except as otherwise directed by the County the Contractor shall:

- 1. Stop work on the date and to the extent specified.
- 2. Terminate and settle all orders and subcontracts relating to the performance of the terminated work
- 3. Transfer all work in process, completed work, and other materials related to the terminated work as directed by the County.
- 4. Continue and complete all parts of that work that have not been terminated.

B. <u>Termination for Convenience:</u>

The County, by written notice, may terminate this contract, in whole or in part, when it is in the County's interest. If this contract is terminated, the County shall be liable only for goods or services delivered and accepted. The County Notice of Termination shall provide the Contractor thirty (30) calendar days prior notice before it becomes effective. A termination for convenience may apply to individual delivery orders, purchase orders or to the contract in its entirety.

9. AS SPECIFIED

All goods delivered shall meet the specifications herein. Goods delivered not as specified shall be returned at no expense by Orange County. The County may return, for full credit, any unused goods received which fail to meet the County's performance standards. Replacement goods meeting specifications shall be submitted within a reasonable time after rejection of the non-conforming goods.

10. COMPLIANCE WITH OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH

By submission of a quote in response to this solicitation, the Quoter certifies that all material, equipment, etc., contained in their quote meets all OSHA requirements. Quoter further certifies that if they are the awarded Contractor, and the material, equipment, etc., delivered is subsequently found to be deficient in any OSHA requirements in effect on date of delivery, all costs necessary to bring the material, equipment, etc., into compliance with the aforementioned requirements shall be borne by the Contractor.

11. <u>SAFETY REGULATIONS</u>

Equipment shall meet all State and Federal safety regulations.

12. CODES AND REGULATIONS

The Contractor shall strictly comply with all Federal, State and local codes and regulations.

13. PAYMENT

Partial payments for the value of goods received and accepted and services rendered may be requested by the submission of a properly executed invoice, with supporting documents if required. Payment shall be made in accordance with Florida Statute 218, Local Government Prompt Payment Act. - 5. Monthly Statement shall be included with invoice by the 15th of each month.

In the event additional County Departments/Divisions or other public entities utilize this contract, invoices are to be sent directly to the Department or entity placing the order.

14. <u>SAMPLES/DEMONSTRATIONS</u>

Samples of any goods for demonstration shall be furnished upon request for a quality test or comparison without cost to the County.

15. EQUIPMENT/SERVICE

- A. The scope of these specifications is to insure the delivery of a complete unit ready for operation. Omission of any essential detail from these specifications does not relieve the Contractor from furnishing a complete unit.
- B. All equipment shall be new, or current manufacture in production at the time of quote opening and carry standard warranties. The Contractor shall service all equipment prior to delivery.
- C. Quotes shall be considered only on equipment which can, on short notice, be serviced and maintained by the Contractor. At the time of quote opening, the Quoter shall be an authorized dealer, distributor, and/or representative of the manufacturer for the brand/model being quote. For the purposes of this solicitation, dealer, distributor, and/or representative means a firm or person that owns, operates, or maintains a store, warehouse, or other establishment in which materials, supplies, parts, articles, or equipment of the general character described in the specifications are bought, kept in stock and sold commercially or to the general public in the usual course of business. The Quoter shall maintain a normal supply of repair parts and be equipped with personnel and facilities to provide such service as necessary to keep the equipment in operation with a minimum of delay. Failure to meet these requirements, in the County's sole opinion, may be cause for rejection.
- D. Quoter shall indicate the nearest available location for replacement parts, how long parts shall be available on the market and the number of days to receive parts after receipt of order. The space for this information is included on the Quote Response Form.

16. ASSEMBLY AND/OR PLACEMENT

All goods shall be completely assembled by the Contractor prior to acceptance by Orange County. Space shall be provided by the County for on-site assembly by the Contractor. It shall be the responsibility of the Contractor to supply the necessary labor and materials for

the placement of all equipment as specified herein. Equipment shall be set-up, serviced, tested and demonstrated at no charge to Orange County.

17. SAFETY AND PROTECTION OF PROPERTY

The Contractor shall at all times:

- A. Initiate, maintain and supervise all safety precautions and programs in connection with its services or performance of its operations under this contract.
- B. Take all reasonable precautions to prevent injury to employees, including County employees and all other persons affected by their operations.
- C. Take all reasonable precautions to prevent damage or loss to property of Orange County, or of other Contractors, consultants or agencies and shall be held responsible for replacing or repairing any such loss or damage.
- D. Comply with all ordinances, rules, regulations, standards and lawful orders from authority bearing on the safety of persons or property or their protection from damage, injury or loss. This includes but is not limited to:
 - Occupational Safety and Health Act (OSHA)
 - o National Institute for Occupational Safety & Health (NIOSH)
 - o National Fire Protection Association (NFPA)
 - American Society of Heating, Refrigeration & Air-Conditioning Engineers (ASHRAE)
- E. The Contractor shall also comply with the guidelines set forth in the Orange County Safety & Health Manual. The manual can be accessed online at the address listed below:

18. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

Vendor/Contractor agrees to maintain on a primary basis and at its sole expense, at all times throughout the duration of this contract the following types of insurance coverage with limits and on forms (including endorsements) as described herein. These requirements, as well as the County's review or acceptance of insurance maintained by Vendor/Contractor is not intended to and shall not in any manner limit or qualify the liabilities assumed by Vendor/Contractor under this contract. Vendor/Contractor is required to maintain any coverage required by federal and state workers' compensation or financial responsibility laws including but not limited to Chapter 324 and 440, Florida Statutes, as may be amended from time to time.

The Vendor/Contractor shall require and ensure that each of its sub-Vendors/sub-Contractors providing services hereunder (if any) procures and maintains until the completion of their respective services, insurance of the types and to the limits specified herein.

Insurance carriers providing coverage required herein must be licensed to conduct business in the State of Florida and must possess a current A.M. Best's Financial Strength Rating of A- Class VIII or better.

Required Coverage:

Commercial General Liability - The Vendor/Contractor shall maintain coverage issued on the most recent version of the ISO form as filed for use in Florida or its equivalent, with a limit of liability of not less than \$1,000,000 (one million dollars) per occurrence. Vendor/Contractor further agrees coverage shall not contain any endorsement(s) excluding or limiting Product/Completed Operations, Contractual Liability, or Separation of Insureds. The General Aggregate limit shall either apply separately to this contract or shall be at least twice the required occurrence limit.

Required Endorsements:

- Additional Insured- CG 20 26 or CG 20 10/CG 20 37 or their equivalents.

 Note: CG 20 10 must be accompanied by CG 20 37 to include products/completed operations
- Waiver of Transfer of Rights of Recovery- CG 24 04 or its equivalent. Note: If blanket endorsements are being submitted please include the entire endorsement and the applicable policy number.
- Business Automobile Liability The Vendor/Contractor shall maintain coverage for all owned; non-owned and hired vehicles issued on the most recent version of the ISO form as filed for use in Florida or its equivalent, with limits of not less than \$500,000 (five hundred thousand dollars) per accident. In the event the Vendor/Contractor does not own automobiles the Vendor/Contractor shall maintain coverage for hired and non-owned auto liability, which may be satisfied by way of endorsement to the Commercial General Liability policy or separate Business Auto Liability policy.
- Workers' Compensation The Vendor/Contractor shall maintain coverage for its employees with statutory workers' compensation limits, and no less than \$100,000 each incident of bodily injury or disease for Employers' Liability. Elective exemptions as defined in Florida Statute 440 will be considered on a case-by-case basis. Any Vendor/Contractor using an employee leasing company shall complete the Leased Employee Affidavit.

Required Endorsements:

Waiver of Subrogation- WC 00 03 13 or its equivalent

When a self-insured retention or deductible exceeds \$100,000 the COUNTY reserves the right to request a copy of Vendor/Contractor most recent annual report or audited financial statement. For policies written on a "Claims-Made" basis the Vendor/Contractor agrees to maintain a retroactive date prior to or equal to the effective date of this contract. In the event the policy is canceled, non-renewed, switched to occurrence form, or any other event

which triggers the right to purchase a Supplemental Extended Reporting Period (SERP) during the life of this contract the Vendor/Contractor agrees to purchase the SERP with a minimum reporting period of not less than two years. Purchase of the SERP shall not relieve the Vendor/Contractor of the obligation to provide replacement coverage.

By entering into this contract Vendor/Contractor agrees to provide a waiver of subrogation or a waiver of transfer of rights of recovery, in favor of the County for the workers' compensation and general liability policies as required herein. When required by the insurer or should a policy condition not permit the Vendor/Contractor to enter into a pre-loss agreement to waive subrogation without an endorsement, then Vendor/Contractor agrees to notify the insurer and request the policy be endorsed with a Waiver of Subrogation or a Waiver of Transfer of Rights of Recovery Against Others endorsement.

Prior to execution and commencement of any operations/services provided under this contract the Vendor/Contractor shall provide the COUNTY with current certificates of insurance evidencing all required coverage. In addition to the certificate(s) of insurance the Vendor/Contractor shall also provide endorsements for each policy as specified above. All specific policy endorsements shall be in the name of the Orange County, Florida.

For continuing service contracts renewal certificates shall be submitted immediately upon request by either the COUNTY or the COUNTY's contracted certificate compliance management firm. The certificates shall clearly indicate that the Vendor/Contractor has obtained insurance of the type, amount and classification as required for strict compliance with this insurance section. Vendor/Contractor shall notify the COUNTY not less than thirty (30) business days (ten business days for non-payment of premium) of any material change in or cancellation/non-renewal of insurance coverage. The Vendor/Contractor shall provide evidence of replacement coverage to maintain compliance with the aforementioned insurance requirements to the COUNTY or its certificate management representative five (5) business days prior to the effective date of the replacement policy (ies).

19. CONTRACT TERM/RENEWAL

A. The contract resulting from this Request for Quotations shall commence effective upon issuance of a term contract by the County and extend for a period of one (1) year(s). The contract may be renewed for two (2) additional one (1) year periods, upon mutual agreement of both parties. If any such renewal results in changes in

the terms and conditions, such changes shall be reduced to writing as an amendment to this contract and such amendment shall be executed by both parties.

- B. The initiating County department(s) shall issue delivery/purchase orders against the term contract on an "as needed" basis.
- C. If the quantity of a unit priced item in this contract is an estimated quantity and the actual quantities ordered are more than 50% above the estimated quantity, the County shall enter into negotiations with the Contractor for a lower unit price which shall be incorporated into the contract. Failure of the Contractor to agree to a reduced unit price may result in the termination of the contract and re-solicitation of the requirement.
- D. Any order issued during the effective period of this contract, but not completed within that period, shall be completed by the Contractor within the time specified in the order. The contract shall govern the Contractor's and the County's rights and obligations with respect to that order to the extent as if the order were completed during the contract performance period.

20. PRICING

The County requires a firm price for the entire contract period. Invoices shall be reviewed to confirm compliance with contract pricing. Failure to hold prices firm shall be grounds for immediate termination of the contract.

21. PRICE ESCALATION/DE-ESCALATION (CPI)

The County may allow a price escalation provision within this award.

The original contract prices shall be firm for the entirety of the initial **one** (1) year contract period. A price escalation/de-escalation will be considered at the time of contract renewal and at 1-year intervals thereafter, provided the Contractor notifies the County, in writing, of the pending price escalation/de-escalation a minimum of sixty (60) days prior to the contract renewal date. Price adjustments shall be based on the latest version of the Consumers Price Index (CPI-U) for All Urban Consumers, All Items, U.S. City Average, non-seasonal, as published by the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics. This information is available at www.bls.gov.

Price adjustment shall be calculated by applying the simple percentage model to the CPI data. This method is defined as subtracting the base period index value (at the time of initial award) from the index value at time of calculation (latest version of the CPI published as of the date of request for price adjustment), divided by the base period index value to identify percentage of change, then multiplying the percentage of change by 100 to identify the percentage change. Formula is as follows:

Current Index – Base Index / Base Index = % of Change

% of Change x 100 = Percentage Change

A price increase may be requested only at each time interval specified above, using the methodology outlined in this section. To request a price increase, Contractor shall submit a letter stating the percentage amount of the requested increase and adjusted price to the Orange County Procurement Division. The letter shall include the complete calculation utilizing the formula above, and a copy of the CPI-U index table used in the calculation. The maximum allowable increase shall not exceed 4%, unless authorized by the Manager, Procurement Division. If approved, the price adjustment shall become effective on the contract renewal date. All price adjustments must be accepted by the Manager, Procurement Division and shall be memorialized by written amendment to this contract. No retroactive contract price adjustments will be allowed.

Should the CPI-U for All Urban Consumers, All Items, U.S City Average, as published by the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics decrease during the term of the contract, or any renewals, the Contractor shall notify the Orange County Procurement Division of price decreases in the method outlined above. If approved, the price adjustment shall become effective on the contract renewal date. If the Contractor fails to pass the decrease on to the County, the County reserves the right to place the Contractor in default, cancel the award, and remove the Contractor from the County Vendor List for a period of time deemed suitable by the County. In the event of this occurrence, the County further reserves the right to utilize any options as stated herein.

22. <u>CONDITIONS FOR EMERGENCY/HURRICANE OR DISASTER - TERM CONTRACTS</u>

It is hereby made a part of this Request for Quotations that before, during and after a public emergency, disaster, hurricane, flood, or other acts of God that Orange County shall require a "first priority" basis for goods and services. It is vital and imperative that the majority of citizens are protected from any emergency situation which threatens public health and safety, as determined by the County. Contractor agrees to rent/sell/lease all goods and services to the County or other governmental entities as opposed to a private citizen, on a first priority basis. The County expects to pay contractual prices for all goods or services required during an emergency situation. Contractor shall furnish a twenty-four (24) hour phone number in the event of such an emergency.

23. REQUIREMENTS CONTRACT

This is a Requirements Contract and the County's intent is to order from the Contractor all of the goods or services specified in the contract's price schedule that are required to be purchased by the County. If the County urgently requires delivery of goods or services before the earliest date that delivery may be required under this contract, and if the

contractor will not accept an order providing for accelerated delivery, the County may acquire the goods or services from another source.

The County's requirements in this contract are estimated and there is no commitment by the County to order any specified amount. If the estimated quantities are not achieved, this shall not be the basis for an equitable adjustment.

If the Manager, Procurement Division determines that the Contractor's performance is less than satisfactory, the County may order the goods or services from other sources until the deficient performance has been cured or the contract terminated.

24. USE OF CONTRACT BY OTHER GOVERNMENT AGENCIES

At the option of the Contractor, the use of the contract resulting from this solicitation may be extended to other governmental agencies, including the State of Florida, its agencies, political subdivisions, counties, and cities.

Each governmental agency allowed by the Contractor to use this contract shall do so independent of any other governmental entity. Each agency shall be responsible for its own purchases and shall be liable only for goods or services ordered, received and accepted. No agency receives any liability by virtue of this quote and subsequent contract award.

SECTION 3 SCOPE OF SERVICES

SCOPE OF SERVICES

The Orange County Convention Center (OCCC) is a high-profile Convention Center requiring Four Diamond level of support services. Four Diamond facilities as defined by AAA are establishments that are upscale in all areas. Accommodations are progressively more refined and stylish. The physical attributes reflect an obvious enhanced level of quality throughout. The fundamental hallmarks at this level include an extensive array of amenities combined with a high degree of hospitality, service and attention to detail. As it pertains to Air Freshener Service in the OCCC Restrooms, this requires service to ensure that all air fresheners equipment is changed at least quarterly and maintained in an appropriate manner so as to enhance the OCCC's services to those groups and companies that utilize the OCCC for conventions, meetings, meals, and other assorted events.

To fulfill that requirement, the OCCC desires to enter into a contract with a Contractor to provide air freshener service in the restrooms in the North/South Building and West Building. The air fresheners shall be battery-operated with an organic block fragrance.

1. <u>DESIGNATED REPRESENTATIVE</u>

The OCCC representative will be the Facility Operations Manager or designee. After contract award, questions regarding this scope of services shall be directed to him/her. Contract related questions shall be referred to the Administrative Supervisor.

This shall be a performance-based contract. The lack of inspections by the OCCC or any error or omission in this scope of services shall not relieve the Contractor of its obligation to perform Services in accordance with generally accepted industry standards.

2. GENERAL INFORMATION

- A. Hours of performance for Maintenance and Repair services shall be:
 - 1. Standard Hours: Standard working hours are Monday through Friday, 6:00 AM to 6:00 PM, excluding the following Orange County Holidays.
 - New Year's Day
 - Martin Luther King Day
 - Memorial Day
 - Fourth of July
 - Veteran's Day
 - Thanksgiving Day and the Friday after Thanksgiving Day
 - Christmas Day and Christmas Eve
 - 2. Non-Standard Hours: Non-standard working hours are all hours other than Monday through Friday, 6:01 PM to 5:59 AM, weekends, and Orange County holidays. The Contractor must provide a 24-hour point of contact for Non-Standard working hours.

Since the OCCC operates twenty-four (24) hours per day, if the Contractor elects to perform scheduled maintenance and inspections outside the Standard Hours stated above to avoid congestion caused by show activity held at the OCCC during Standard Hours, the Contractor shall not receive any extra compensation.

- B. The Contractor shall perform all its obligations and functions in a professional and business-like manner. The Contractor shall use its best efforts to coordinate its activities with and adjust its activities to the needs and requirements of the OCCC and to perform its activities so as not to disrupt, unreasonably interfere with or delay the operations or activities of the OCCC.
- C. Each of the Contractor's motor vehicles brought onto the OCCC's property shall have the Contractor's business name and/or logo prominently displayed on both front doors of such vehicle.

D. TRAVEL/MILEAGE COSTS

The Contractor shall be responsible for all of its travel and per diem costs to and from the OCCC. Travel time shall not be included when quoting and or invoicing for as needed or emergency repairs and shall not be compensated by the County under any circumstances. Chargeable hours for repairs start when arriving at OCCC. OCCC will not reimburse the Contractor for lunch time taken by a Contractor's employee while on OCCC property.

3. <u>CONTRACTOR PERSONNEL</u>

- A. All Contractor employees shall be able to communicate, understand and follow written and verbal instructions in English and be able to identify and understand all signs and notices in and/or around the OCCC.
- B. Supervision of Personnel: The Contractor shall be responsible for the supervision and execution of contracted services by its employees. At a minimum, a Quarterly Inspection of OCCC conditions shall be conducted by Contractor's Regional Manager or equivalent to ensure that all maintenance service hereunder are properly performed. The Contractor shall notify OCCC of the name of such Manager responsible for contracted services and Manager shall have the authority to act as Contractor's agent. The Regional Manager shall notify OCCC of site inspection and provide OCCC with written and electronic confirmation of findings. The Contractor shall have sole responsibility for means, methods, techniques, procedures, safety precautions or employment practices in connection with Contractor's performance of contracted services.

Additionally, the Contractor shall identify a lead person or supervisor with whom the OCCC Representative may consult regarding contract performance.

- C. The Contractor shall ensure that each of its employees are properly qualified and will use reasonable care in the performance of maintenance services. If OCCC, in OCCC's sole opinion determines, for any reason, that the qualifications, actions or conduct of any particular Contractor employee has violated this Contract by performing unsatisfactory work, interfering with operation of OCCC, unnecessarily disrupting occupants, other contractors or subcontractors then at OCCC, or that such actions or conduct is otherwise detrimental to OCCC, then upon OCCC's written notice, the Contractor shall immediately provide qualified replacement.
- D. All personnel provided by the Contractor, whether employees of the Contractor or sub-contractors, shall be competent, experienced, courteous, properly dressed with shirt displaying the company name/logo, photo ID badged and skilled in the

maintenance and repair of material handling and lift equipment. The Contractor shall ensure that all employees prominently wear the ID badge on the front of his or her uniform at all times when on OCCC property. Contractor's personnel shall wear appropriate safety shoes during the performance of services under this contract. While working on OCCC property, all the Contractor's employees shall wear neat-appearing uniforms with company logo and footwear of a style that complies with all legal and safety requirements, including and without limitation, the requirements of OSHA and picture ID.

- E. The County reserves the right of approval of any and all Contractor employees and the right to request the removal of any employee. The Contractor agrees to promptly reassign any employee whose performance or behavior the OCCC finds unsatisfactory. In the event of a removal, the employee shall not be returned without the prior approval of the OCCC. If an employee is noted as Do Not Return (DNR'd), that employee shall not return to OCCC for any reason.
- F. The Contractor and their workers shall comply with OCCC Policies and Procedures while on premises. These are available on the OCCC website. The Contractor's workers shall not remove any item such as giveaways, purchased items, trash or leftovers from OCCC property. The Contractor shall instruct its personnel that no gratuities shall be solicited or accepted for any reason whatsoever from tenants, customers or other persons at the OCCC. The Contractor shall be responsible for ensuring that all articles found by its employees on the Center's premises are turned over to the OCCC's designated representative in charge of such articles.
- G. A valid Florida driver's license (Commercial Driver's License, if applicable) will be required of all personnel operating motor vehicles or motorized equipment on roadways in or around the OCCC's property. The Contractor shall ensure that all vehicles used by their staff are properly identified with the company's name and logo.
- H. All maintenance personnel, including subcontractors, must identify themselves upon arrival on site and prior to beginning work and upon completion of work and leaving site. Contractor employees shall report to designated OCCC personnel upon arrival and departure from property in the performance of maintenance services.

I. SUBCONTRACTORS AND SUPPLIERS

Unless first approved in writing by OCCC, Contractor shall have no authority to engage any subcontractors or other parties to perform maintenance services. Neither OCCC approval nor designation of any subcontractors or suppliers nor failure of performance thereof by such parties, shall relieve, release or affect in any manner any of Contractor's duties, liabilities or obligations hereunder, and Contractor shall at all times be and remain fully liable hereunder.

J. The Contractor shall maintain sufficient backup maintenance and repair personnel so that multiple concurrent failures are corrected in a timely manner.

4. <u>SAFETY</u>

- A. All equipment used in the performance of these services shall be properly maintained and subject to inspection by the County upon demand. Any equipment deemed faulty, inoperable, unsafe or improper for its intended purpose shall be moved from the County's premises.
- B. Any damage to OCCC facilities or property due to the services performed by the Contractor shall be the responsibility of the Contractor.
- C. If certification (such as OSHA) is required for operation of any equipment used by the Contractor's employees, the Contractor shall ensure that all certifications are complete and up to date. All Contractor employees shall have copies of their equipment certification on their person when working at OCCC, and shall produce this certification upon request from OCCC employees.
- D. The Contractor shall remove any waste, including but not limited to batteries, rags and damaged/old parts, unless otherwise directed by the OCCC designee.

5. <u>PERFORMANCE</u>

- A. All maintenance and repair work shall be scheduled to provide the least inconvenience to building occupants, events and visitors.
- B. All workmanship shall meet the standards specified herein, and shall be accomplished in accordance with approved and accepted standards of the (1) industry, (2) equipment manufacturer, (3) applicable Federal and local standards and codes, and (4) applicable building and safety codes.
- C. All service visits shall be coordinated with the OCCC Representative.

D. Standards of Conduct

- 1. The Contractor shall maintain satisfactory standards of employee competency, conduct, appearance, and integrity.
- 2. The Contractor's employees shall not be in OCCC private offices without express permission of OCCC personnel, nor shall they disturb papers on desks, open desk drawers or cabinets, or use Orange County telephones, computer equipment, copiers, or printers, except as authorized. OCCC reserves the right to request removal of Contractor's employees that do not observe the standards of conduct.

E. Non-interference with OCCC Business

- 1. The Contractor will be notified by the OCCC Representative as to the manner of starting the work so as to cause a minimum of interference.
- 2. The work shall be performed in such a manner that there will be no interruption or interference with the proper execution of OCCC business. Verbal interaction between Contractor's employees and building occupants shall be kept to a minimum.

3. The Contractor agrees to alter work methods, schedules and procedures if OCCC Representative determines that they are detrimental to County operations.

F. Cooperation with Other Contractors

If any other contractors are on the same job-site conducting work, the OCCC Representative will inform the Contractor. The Contractor shall cooperate with and ensure non-interference of any other work being performed at the job site by other contractors.

6. CONTRACTOR'S PERSONNEL – SECURITY AND BACKGROUND REQUIREMENTS

The following conditions are required for all Contractor's employees assigned to work at the Orange County Convention Center.

- A. CONTRACTOR shall, at its expense, perform annual local, state and federal background and reference checks, including criminal background checks, on all prospective/current employees to be assigned to Orange County Government, for every county of residence, domestic or foreign, of prospective employees for the past 7 years. Such checks shall include any convictions involving any violent crime or crimes against children, any crime involving theft, possession, receipt of stolen property or sale/use or possession of illegal drugs. All prospective employees shall also be required to have passed a 5-panel drug screening. The 5-panel drug screening shall include THC, Opioids, Amphetamines, Methamphetamines, and Cocaine.
- B. CONTRACTOR agrees not to refer or place at Orange County Government any individual having such a criminal record during the 7-year period preceding placement at Orange County Government, unless Orange County Government specifically agrees. Orange County Government reserves the right to have CONTRACTOR remove any employee from placement at Orange County Government if such individual is arrested, charged or convicted of such crimes while placed at Orange County Government or has determined to falsify their application to conceal their information in anyway. Orange County reserves the right to request to inspect the background and/or drug screening results to ensure compliance with contractual provisions. A list of the CONTRACTOR'S employees who have successfully passed the background check and drug screen and assigned to work at the OCCC shall be submitted to the OCCC Security Supervisor or their designee, prior to being permitted to work at the OCCC. This list shall be updated on an annual basis.
- C. The Contractor shall ensure that all vehicles used by their staff are properly identified with the companies name and logo.
- D. The Contractor shall remove from Convention Center premises any of its employees who, in the opinion of the County's Representative, or designee, is not performing the services in a proper manner, or who is incompetent, disorderly, abusive, dangerous, disruptive, or does not comply with the rules and regulations of the County. The Contractor shall in no way, interpret such removal to require dismissal or other disciplinary action of the employee. Employees shall not use controlled substances, unless prescribed, nor illegal substances, and shall not use alcohol on the Center premises. The Convention Center Representative will request that anyone suspected of working under the influence of alcohol or controlled substances be removed from the workplace.

E. OCCC Photo Identification Badges will be issued on an as-needed basis for the Contractor's employees that have successfully passed their background check and five panel drug screen check. Badges are the property of the OCCC. Each lost and/or misplaced badge will result in a \$50.00 replacement fee, payable to the OCCC. Payment should be taken to the Business Services office prior to obtaining the replacement badge (receipt must be presented in order to receive a replacement badge). Keys may also be issued to Contractor's employees on an as-needed basis. All keys are the property of the OCCC. There will be a \$50.00 charge per key for all lost and unreturned keys. If multiple cores must be changed due to a missing key, the Contractor shall be responsible for all the core changes. Core changes are \$50.00 per core.

7. PARKING

The OCCC will identify locations where Contractor vehicle parking is available. Orange County will not be responsible for any damage to Contractor or Contractor's employees' vehicles while parked on Orange County property. Vehicles towed from Orange County property will be at the expense of the Contractor or Contractor's employee. Contractor and Contractor's employee vehicles shall be properly identified.

8. <u>SCOPE OF SERVICES</u>

The Contractor shall perform the services under this contract, per the following requirements:

A. Equipment

The air freshener shall be a battery-operated fan air freshener and an organic block fragrance (a mixture of aroma chemicals, essential oils, and natural extracts compressed into fibrous squares or similar size/shape that will fit into the air freshener). The aroma would preferably be orange-scented, but OCCC will consider other citrus or floral fragrances.

B. Initial Installation Service

A one-time installation of battery-operated fan air fresheners with an organic block fragrance is required in all restrooms. Some restrooms will require two units due to the size of the restroom which will be determined by the OCCC designee. The OCCC designee will also coordinate the installation schedule. This initial installation will occur in year one of the contract.

C. Maintenance Service

Monthly maintenance service shall include the replacement of all organic block fragrances in all units every four weeks. Replace any stolen, vandalized, and/or broken machines found when serving the equipment at no additional cost.

Batteries in all units shall be replaced every three months. Batteries shall be disposed of by the Contractor per local recycling statues.

WHAT IS THE RELATIONSHIP DISCLOSURE FORM?

The Relationship Disclosure Form (form OC CE 2D and form OC CE 2P) is a form created pursuant to the County's Local Code of Ethics, codified at Article XIII of Chapter 2 of the Orange County Code, to ensure that all development-related items and procurement items presented to or filed with the County include information as to the relationship, if any, between the applicant and the County Mayor or any member of the Board of County Commissioners (BCC). The form will be a part of the backup information for the applicant's item.

WHY ARE THERE TWO RELATIONSHIP DISCLOSURE FORMS?

Form OC CE 2D is used only for development-related items, and form OC CE 2P is used only for procurement-related items. The applicant needs to complete and file the form that is applicable to his/her case.

WHO NEEDS TO FILE THE RELATIONSHIP DISCLOSURE FORM?

Form OC CE 2D should be completed and filed by the owner of record, contract purchaser, or authorized agent. Form OC CE 2P should be completed and filed by the bidder, offeror, quoter, or respondent, and, if applicable, their authorized agent. In all cases, the person completing the form must sign the form and warrant that the information provided on the form is true and correct.
